### Webmaster Report

#### Tech Tips

Technology has become a vital part of our everyday lives. Many of us are navigating this information explosion as a novice, seeking guidance often. As we travel and visit friends and family this summer, I'd like to share a few tech tips to consider to keep you and your devices happy.

- 1) When using a search engine like Google, Firefox, Bing,. do not select the first site at the top of your search. Companies are paying these search engines to be put at the top of the list. When the internet first came out, searched websites were placed in order of most popular, but today the first websites are paid to be there. Select the ones that DO NOT say "sponsored". Also note that many of the sponsored sites may leave you vulnerable to hackers.
- 2) If you download a PDF file and you see "exe" and the end. Delete it... DO NOT open it. It may be another way hackers can access your files. PDF files should always end with "pdf".
- 3) Wifi at airports and hotels cost money to log in sometimes. You can use it by adding "?.jpg" at the end of your URL address (the official address of your desired website)
- 4) Before you close a website... logout!
- 5) Need a picture of your screen? Look for the "print screen" button on your keyboards, sometimes "PrtSC". The picture will be saved in a screenshot folder in your pictures.
- 6) Remember technology is only useful if you know how to access its true power.
