MONEY MATTERS

The 2022-2023 budget for Alpha Upsilon Chapter was recently passed at our September 17, 2022 meeting held at the Bloser Mansion. We projected 33 members paying dues. Out of this number, 22 of us are paying the full amount of \$107.00.

Our bylaws give those of us over the age of 70 the option of paying the reduced amount of \$87.00. This option is not a mandate if we attain the magic year of 70. Select this amount only if you need a financial reduction. Many of us have selected to pay the regular amount to help the chapter move forward.
