#### **From Carolyn Sutton**

When I think about Ann, I like to think that we had much in common. We both loved being an educator. We both loved children's literature and would often attend the same lectures and book festivals. We both have shelves full of autographed editions of children's books. Once, she asked me to be a storyteller for each of her classes at Stewart School where she was the principal. One year, we were roomies at the Shippensburg Conference.

We liked good food. Our favorite lunch location was Hoffstots in Oakmont, and I would often see her there. Ann loved The Greenbriar, and she and I traveled together when the Northeast Regional Conference was held there. Ann had been to The Greenbriar many times with her family, so she was eager to share this special resort with me.

Ann and I both loved Delta Kappa Gamma. We both served Alpha Upsilon as officers, including chapter president. When she was no longer attending meetings, she still supported the chapter with her donations. Ann and I loved our DKG sisters, and we were also very close to our biological sisters.

#### Judy Schaffer's comments about Ann Palmer

She was always known as Ann S. Palmer and for many years I did not know that her middle name was Sidney. She was both a teaching colleague in New Kensington-Arnold and a friend! We developed our friendship as members of the New Kensington Junior Woman's Club and later both served terms as club presidents. Ann always called me on the phone to ask about what dues she owed, no matter what organization, and sent me her check. I would always pass it on to the treasurer. When I did not get the call, I knew something was wrong and paid her dues myself.

If I had to describe Ann, I would say - Always Smiling, Dependable, Friendly, loved her teaching jobs and her kids, spoke well about everyone and was a True Lady!

#### Barbara Gasperini remembers Ann

I met Ann her first day as the new principal of Stewart Elementary School in Lower Burrell. She was a genuine person of kindness. She had a special place for every student in her heart by trying to understand them and helping them in any way she could. I thought the students felt they could go to her, and she would try to understand their problems.

Her smile was infectious. She made you feel happy as you passed her in the hall. She was very helpful when she observed you and always looked for the positive. By being open minded, she was willing to accept change. I never hesitated to go to her office because her door was always open. If we stop and think of Ann Palmer, a smile will form on your face. I wish I could thank her for setting high expectations for educators and students. As principal, Ann shaped the conditions for her teachers and students to learn and succeed, we are forever grateful for her impact on education.

#### Barbara Summers' memory about Ann

My memory of Ann Palmer is that she was a mentor to me... she was the first teacher to allow me into her classroom my freshman year at PSU and tutor a young man in reading. She guided me along the way.
