### Winter 2024

The start of another new year - where does the time go? I hope everyone enjoyed a wonderful holiday season and is now settling in for a long winter's nap!

Recently, I attended a zoom meeting held by PA President Royce Boyd. We had a nice group of women in attendance, and it was quite informative. I would like to share some of the information that we covered.

- Dr. Lyn Schmid presented ideas for the struggles of finding officers and overcoming objections for reasons not to be involved in holding a chapter office.
- She suggested running the chapter as a community, rather than having a slate of officers and using the four main officers to rotate, each taking a meeting and run it rather than leaving it up to one specific person.
- Dr. Schmid also suggested running executive boarding meetings as communities. She said the culture of our society is changing and we need to change with it to keep our membership growing.

- Under the new guidelines, we no longer need to vote a new member into our society. As soon as a person pays her dues, she is then a member of DKG. In addition an induction ceremony is no longer required. Dr. Lyn and Royce both said that a 'welcome' is more necessary than a vote.
- Another area that was covered is how younger women communicate, and that chapters need to take that into consideration. Both Royce and Dr. Lyn said that communication is either going to make us or break us.

A few other pieces of information that were shared:

- The spring <u>Keystonian</u> will include information for the State Convention which is at the Mariott and how to register.
- Margie Zorn and Marcie Erickson are looking for presenters for the State Convention.
- There are some good new suggestions on the state website for fund raising to be considered by our chapter.

I will share more of these ideas at the next Executive Board meeting.

2024, Leap Year, is already one month old! Our DKG Chapter 2024 goal is to raise funds for our annual \$1,000.00 scholarship, given to a senior girl planning to enter college in an educational field.

Let's reflect back on the history of this goal!

In 1964, we awarded our first recorded scholarship going to Mary Christy of New Kensington. Through 1969, our chapter gave two scholarships each year. (Barbara Mason Gasperini, a graduate of Burrell was the 1966-chapter recipient.) Since then, through 2022, we have awarded one scholarship each year. 63 seniors have been supported by Alpha Upsilon Chapter, totaling approximately \$63,000.00.

Your Finance Committee (Schaffer, Grossheim, Sutton, Hilty, Ewing and Summers through various projects with your help in 2023, has raised approximately \$886.00.
